Music therapy with children of the severely disabled group at LIFEGATE

Dear friends!

In contrast to the hot and very dry summer in Europe, the weather here was comparatively pleasant. But for us this was not a summer with a prolonged period of relaxed holiday feeling. Another armed conflict lies behind us, which began when Israeli forces killed a leader of the Jihad Islami leader who had been preparing attacks in Israel in his home in Gaza. In retaliation, attacks were carried out by militiamen who launched more than 900 rockets from the Gaza Strip into southern Israel. The Israeli missile defense system "Iron Dome" / "Kipat Barsel" intercepted about 97 percent of the rockets. Nevertheless, a few Israelis were injured by rocket fragments and a dozen people were injured when they fell whilst trying to escape into shelters. In response to the rocket fire, the Israeli Air Force attacked targets in the Gaza Strip, killing more than 44 people. The second highest-ranking leader of Jihad Islami died in one of the Israeli attacks, while the "Number 1" gave his orders from Tehran.

A few days after the start of the ceasefire between the Israeli military and the Jihad Islami, the Iranian reconnaissance satellite "Khavvam" was launched by means of a Russian carrier rocket into Earth orbit. Now speculation is rife as to the extent to which Iranian and Russian military can spy not only the Israeli army in Israel, but also troop movements including movements of Ukrainian armed forces in Ukraine. More than this, we are following with concern the news we are receiving about Iran's nuclear program. The new international negotiations on the

so-called "Iran nuclear agreement" (JCPO) have since failed. Moreover, the International Atomic Energy Agency reported in June that within a few weeks, Iran would have produced sufficient fissile material for a nuclear bomb. According to Israeli officials, development of an Iranian nuclear bomb can no longer be prevented peacefully. Despite this situation we believe that the "Guardian of Israel" does not sleep nor does he slumber (Psalm 121) and that. in the end, all the inhabitants of the land and all people who want to live together in peace, will profit.

There are many places in this world where we need patience, strong faith, and the certainty that God's power, working through the weak, will come to fruition. God's power will carry us through difficult situations and our connection to HIM will always bring us new hope. This applies to everyday life as much as it does to the big issues of this world. As "salt" we may provide some "spicy" contribution and as "light" illuminate the darkness and thus enable growth and development. Both are given to us. We can open ourselves for it to happen through us and that our world thereby becomes "tastier and brighter".

Mobility for people with disabilities through the LIFEGATE aid supply

It is a cause of rejoicing to be able to supply children and young people in our region with aids that contribute to their mobility and thus to their quality of life. And many expressions of gratitude reach our team. In the following, we describe the activities in this department of LIFEGATE, which is progressing well, in large part thanks to the cooperation with various individuals and organizations.

US-American aid organizations provide us every vear with used, but well-preserved, relief supplies. And our field team has been cooperating in the entire the West Bank and beyond with local organizations. institutions and individuals for years. In the LIFEGATE center, but also during visits, the first contacts are made with people with disabilities who are in need of wheelchairs or other aids. After a first measuring, the "fine tuning" begins in our workshops. For example, a "standard wheelchair" is precisely adapted to the child or adult. At foot, head and side, supports and sometimes entire seat shells are specifically manufactured and fitted. A LIFEGATE vehicle is equipped with the individually adapted aids and tools for mobile use. Our employees can then carry out the supply and repair at various locations in our region. Also the distribution of replacement wheelchairs, crutches, rollators, hospital beds, etc. are part of the team's tasks. In addition to the Palestinian members of the aid team, German and U.S. experts provide practical support in this important area.

Looking back on the summer

Our production and service departments were busy during the summer months as well. As a consequence our products could be delivered at the beginning of August and have now arrived safely at our distribution center in Tauberbischofsheim, Germany. Our shoe and leather repair workshop, laundry, orthopaedic technology and medical aids departments provided the necessary customer service. The LIFEGATE therapy department also continued to work throughout the summer for our external patients.

The administration was present for days at a time, one reason being, to our great joy, to finalize the purchase of our neighboring property

This property has now been registered with the local land registry office under LIFEGATE Rehabilitation. A reason once again to thank all the people who have accompanied this process - for your financial help and prayers, quests. We are very happy, and now we want to tackle the last hurdle with the help of our friends: the repayment of two private loans (240,000,- USD) that were generously granted to us for the purchase of land. We welcome any suggestions for fund-raising actions and initiatives. We are also pleased to announce that the LIFEGATE Garden has not come to a standstill during the summer months. Groups came to us for seminars and short stavs. In the last weeks we could also welcome individual quests. Here in Bethlehem, in the Judean Mountains, the summer weather was more pleasant than in the hot Central and Western Europe. Hopefully, word of our pleasant summer months will soon spread and attract more visitors.

Perspectives for the extended work of LIFEGATE

After the summer vacations we are looking forward to the next months with our children and young people and want to be able to provide a good and extensive support. 120 children from the special school are now being supported in eleven classrooms. Two of our original "all-purpose rooms" have already been converted into permanent classrooms.

We have now reached the limits of what is possible with the space available to us. In the kindergarten we are at the limits of our capacity with forty children in five support groups. And the waiting lists for special education places are already filled. We have to disappoint parents who are looking for a special education place. We can often only offer them therapeutic support for their children once or twice a week. We are making plans for the future and, in order to remedy the present situation, a further floor has been planned and the costs have been calculated. Several attempts to find the necessary funds have not vet been successful. But we want to keep trying, because we want to expand the LIFEGATE groups for severely and multiply handicapped children, for whom otherwise there are hardly any places in the entire West Bank and Gaza Strip. On an additional floor, up to forty children could be cared for.

A further department would be dedicated to the promotion of autistic children and their parents. The number of these children is rapidly growing in our society. It would then be possible to open a long-planned hairdressing salon in the vacated rooms in the workshop area, which would offer new training opportunities for our young people and also be a source of revenue for LIFEGATE. We place our plans in God's good hands and ask our friends to bring our concerns to the attention of individuals and organizations.
